


For the fifth year in a row, the 2014 All Star One conference found itself oversubscribed by the March 10 registration deadline (308 registrations were received by midnight on March 10) and registrations continued to come in after that date. Ultimately, 11 people remained on the waitlist at the time of the conference, while 33 people cancelled their registration. Of the cancellations, 6 people cancelled from the waitlist and the remaining 27 cancelled after acceptance.

The conference had a base number of 307 conferees (but not all in one night!). The conference had people coming and going daily, such that the numbers of conferees sleeping on island per night varied (depicted in the chart below). The island staff allowed us to slightly overreach past nightly headcounts because the Housing Coordinator was able to find appropriate housing. Therefore, we were able to hit 295 and 296 on the two highest nights. By comparison, the highest nightly count in 2013 was 293. Our lowest bed count in 2014 was the first night at 286.



In 2014, conferee ages ranged from 8 months to 92! We had slightly fewer kids 17 and under than in the past two years (83 compared to 93 and 92 in 2013 and 2012, respectively). We had a relatively large group of older teenagers this year (there were 17 kids ages 17 and 18) and a very large group of young adults—there were 27 people 18-25 years of age. When using the age group range of 18-39, there has been significant growth over time, as there were 17 people in this age range in 2012, 31 in 2013, and 47 in 2014. There was also a strong population, as in past years, of conferees ages 40-59. This bodes well for good conference attendance in the near future.
