## Selecting Future Chairs - Amendments $1 \& 2$

1. Selection
a. Future Chairs will be selected by the Governing Council at the Summer meeting on Star Island.
b. The Summer meeting will consist of two parts, a public meeting to conduct general business, followed by a closed meeting to select people who will be the Chairs two years hence.
c. Once selected, the future Chairs are Chairs-Elect for the next year, and are the conference Chairs the year following that.
d. In the closed session, the only ones present and eligible to vote will be Past Chair members, Chairs-Elect, and lifetime non-Chair members of the Geverning Couneil whe relinquish (for that year) their eligibility to be nominated.
d. In the closed session, the only ones allowed to participate and to be eligible to vote will be current members of the Governing Council. This includes Past Chairs, Acting-Chairs, Chairs-Elect, and Lifetime and term-limited non-Chair members.
e. In a given year, anyone who participates in the selection process is not eligible, for that year, to be nominated as a future Chair-Elect.

## 2. Eligibility

a. Any member of the All Star I community, that has not been a Chair in the past, is eligible to be chosen as a future Chair.
b. The Chairs will consist of two or three people, either a couple or close friends, who work well together and have a shared vision and desire to run the conference.
c. Non-Chair members of the Governing Council, either temporary or Lifetime members, are eligible to be future Chairs.
d. Any non-Chair members may choose to relinquish their eligibility in any given year. This enables them to participate that year in choosing the future Chairs.
e. If lifetime non-Chair members wish to be eligible for nomination, in a given year, then they may not participate in that year's closed session.

## 3. Nominations

a. Before nominations are started, the room will be cleared of everyone except for current members of the Governing Council past Chairs, Chairs-elect, and lifetime members who have opter for that yo one in the room will be eligible for nomination that year.
b. Only one nomination may be made per person.
c. A second is required for each nomination.
4. Anyone making a nomination, must be an advoeate for the nominees. This requires the nominator to confer with the nominees ahead of time to assess the neminees' desire and avalability serve.
$d e$. The nominees must be on-island that year.
$e$ ef. Each year's nominations are made independently of any nominations made in previous years, i.e. no nominations made in previous years are carried forward.
fy. Family members of those being nominated would be asked to absent themselves during discussion about the nominee.

## 4. Voting

a. The voting will be conducted by a ranked voting process, where each ballot ranks the candidates. The preferred process is called Single Transferrable Vote and is used in City elections in Cambridge, Massachusetts.
b. The results will produce a ranked output. At the end of the closed session, the top three ranked selections will be disclosed to those who voted.
c. The list of nominees and the results of the balloting are strictly confidential and will not be revealed outside of the closed session.
d. To further ensure confidentiality, software possibilities should be explored that can tally the ballots without revealing vote counts.

## 5. Announcements

a. After the meeting, the current Chairs will privately inform the winning candidates of their selection.
b. If they do not accept, the current Chairs will go down the list until new Chairs-Elect are selected.
c. These results will be conveyed to the Governing Council members by a previously agreed upon signal, determined in the closed session.
d. After new Chairs-Elect are chesen, if they wish, adveeates moly let their nominees know that their nomination was not successful.
$d e$. The selection of the new Chairs-Elect will be revealed to the general All Star I membership at the closing banquet.
