Summary of Evaluations (based on 38 online submissions and 16 paper submissions)

- Responses were overwhelmingly positive.

Suggestions for Improving the Conference (in no particular order)

- Reconsider Late Night Music locations and duration, as the combination kept conferees up past their bed times.
- Offer volunteer gardening.
- Keep Stunt Night to an hour.
- Schedule daytime peer group meetings.
- Bring back the 15x20.

- Sponsor multiple get-togethers on Sunday night or Monday morning for parents and guardians with similarly aged children.
- Offer an intergenerational activity on the last day.
- Schedule storytelling with Jen.
- Schedule more yoga, including on Saturday.
- Offer more Talks on the Rocks.
- Bring on bingo.
- Organize icebreakers (e.g. Trivial Pursuit, personal scavenger hunt, family trivia).
- Sell Choke Fest T-shirts again.
- Reinforce bedtime rules.
- Make all payments via Venmo (or checks?), as it was hard to keep track of who paid with cash.
- Offer both boxed and bottled wine.
- Announce Book Club books earlier and have more leaders.
- Sign up more kids for Morning Chapel.
- Set up a satellite Art Barn on the porch and use it for After Hours, too.
- Send the chalk board scribe updates via text message to keep it current, display the following day's schedule on Side 2 of the board for those who want advance notice, and include social hour volunteers so they don't forget to help.
- Conduct the July 4th Games on the main lawn and softball field for the enjoyment of spectators.
- Include fresh vegetables and fruit among the snacks for kids.
- Use a large font and include lanyards (\$25/100 on Amazon) on name tags.
- Use the Voice of Star to make announcements at every meal.
- Offer table sign-up for Banquet Night.
- Increase awareness and assistance for people with mobility challenges.
- Schedule the Writer's Workshop to meet before lunch.
- Match teenagers with technologically challenged older conferees who could use one-on-one assistance.
