

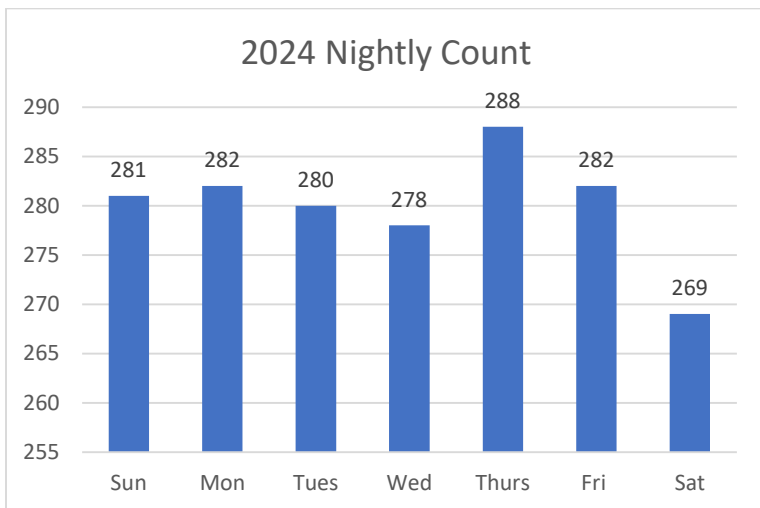
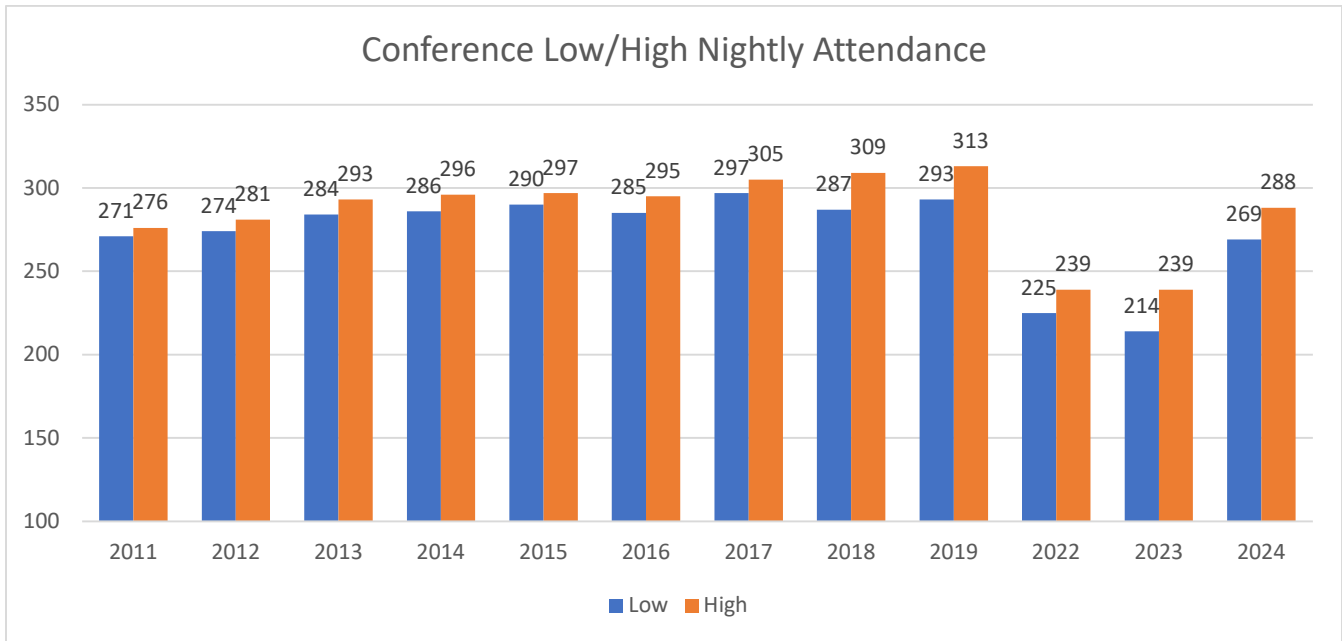
All Star I - 2024

Registrar's Report, Susan O'Loughlin

Registration for the 2024 All Star I Conference opened on January 15, 2024. The Star Island Corporation set an attendance goal of 280 conferees per night.

This year, there were a number of people who left the island early due to illness. The numbers presented below do not include these departures. There were 324 total registrations for the 2024 Conference (285 full week registrations and 39 COGs). We had a lower than usual number of cancellations (26) and 298 people attended All Star I (262 full week and 36 COGs).

As illustrated in the graph below, we housed 288 conferees on the highest night, and 269 on the lowest night (the previous record high was 313 in 2019). In all, the Conference filled 1960 bed-nights (280 avg), which was 100% the Corporation's requested fill of 1960 bed-nights.



In 2024 registered conferee ages ranged from 1 to 87 years. The percentage of children aged 17 and under saw a slight increase, but the numbers are still low and are currently skewed to junior and senior teens. The percentage of conferees aged 18-39 years old was lower than in the past two years, but still higher than its historical average. The 40-59 age group continues to decline while the 60+ age group was at its highest level.

The shifting demographics of the conference has come with housing challenges. The housing needs of our aging population far exceeds the availability of our first-floor rooms. We had more older adults housed in Oceanic in spaces typically occupied by families and young adults.

This year, there were 55 conferees who were new to both All Star I and Star Island. This is a significant increase over prior years and can be attributed to the generous financial discount programs offered by the Star Island Corporation with the goal of recruiting new shoalers.
