All Star I - 2025 Registrar's Report, Beth Corsa

The registrar position transitioned from Susan O'Laughlin to Beth Corsa this year, with Beth shadowing Susan during 2024. Additionally, the Star Island registrar position transitioned from Bill Knox to Mark Woolley and the Island upgraded its Raiser's Edge package. This caused delays for the AS1 registrar to access the system (full access began February 6). Registration for the 2025 All Star I Conference opened on January 15, 2025. The Star Island Corporation set an attendance goal of 280 conferees per night; we were at 260 full weekers, but with the number of COGS, we exceeded the 280 each night.

There were 327 total registrations for the 2025 Conference (260 full week registrations and a record-setting 67 COGs). Of this, 66 were children 1-18; with 19 more in the young adult category. Attrition was down, with only 11 cancellations (26 cancellations in 2024).

As illustrated in the chart, we housed 301 conferees on the highest night, and 285 on the lowest.

In 2025 registered conferee ages ranged from 1 to 88 years.

The housing needs of our aging population far exceeds the availability of our first-floor rooms. Although we were able to welcome new folks trying out the conference and accommodate some young adults who

have limited days off, the record number of COG registrants proved equally challenging in terms of housing.

This year, there were 38 conferees who were new to both All-Star I and Star Island (down from 55 last year, but many new shoalers from 2024 returned in 2025 and invited friends to experience the Island). The generous SIC financial discount programs, with the goal of recruiting new shoalers and getting lapsed ones to return, helped make it possible for people to attend in an uncertain economic landscape. Additionally, this year, they added the Conference Equity Grant. AS1 was able to identify an individual who fulfilled the requirements and figured out housing for this person.
